OLNA

The College wishes to remind parents that students who did not obtain 'Band 8' across the Year 9 NAPLAN components of Comprehension, Writing, and Numeracy, will need to sit an Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment (OLNA) in that specific area. Unlike NAPLAN, the OLNA tests are not optional, as they are now tied in with the requirements for students to obtain a Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) at the end of Year 12. Please note the OLNA tests are due to occur on the following dates at the College: 10th of March – Writing

11th of March – Comprehension (Reading) 12th of March – Numeracy

UNIFORMS

Girls skirts/dresses need to touch their knee (not just come above it), their socks are to be white, ankle length with preferably one fold. Hair any longer than shoulder length, needs to be fully tied back.

Boys trousers need to sit on their waist and belts are to be black only. Grey socks are also to be worn, preferably with a fold. Boys shirts are to be tucked in.

Jewellery should only consist of a wristwatch, and round, plain silver or gold studs worn in the lower lobes only. No bandaids are allowed to be worn over other earrings. Male students should not be wearing any earrings.

Shoes should be black laces (no velcro), plain uppers, a closed toe and heel, and a heel (maximum sole depth of 2 cm) capable of being polished. No cloth shoes, no suede, and no contrast stitching or logo.

No brogues, boots, sneakers or skate shoes.

BUDDY HOMEWORK CLASSES

WEDNESDAY 3:30pm - 4:30pm

What is a buddy homework class?

- 1. Working with a buddy that you setup, to help you with one or more of your weaker subjects.
- 2. A group of friends who want to work on an assignment that requires group participation.
- 3. You have an external tutor that you have organised and you need a place to conduct these sessions.
- 4. You have organised tutoring from one of your teachers but your session is only half an hour and you can't be picked up until 4:30 and would like to study for the last half an hour.
- 5. Wanting to study at school and need access to the computers either as an individual or as a group.

What are the rules of the buddy homework class?

1. No disruptions to other people in different booths as there should be no reason to talk to others.

(Asking someone a quick question is allowed, but having a conversation with others means you are not there as a buddy, but as a group and this needed to be organised at the beginning the session.)

- 2. Do not be too loud within your own group. If this is the case, you will not be able to return, as others will need a quiet working environment. However, if you know you are going to be loud and there needs to be robust discussion, we can organise another classroom for this to happen in.
- 3. Any laptops used during the session will need to be returned and plugged in to ensure that they are charged for the next day. If students fail to plug in their computers, they won't be able to use them during the next session. Students can also use their own laptops or iPads but will need a letter from parents approving this prior to the session.
- 4. If students are doing the wrong thing then they will not be able to return, and if their behaviour is particularly distracting to other students, then parents will be called to pick them up as we are trying to create an environment of students working towards excellence.

How do you book a booth in a buddy homework class?

These classes will need to be booked with Ms Lever by email. If your group size is over 4, you will need to organise with a teacher to limit disruptions to other students, and will be allocated a booth in room 1 for the session. This may be a one off class, or you may wish to book in for the whole term. As we only have 7 booths in room 1, (and a group of desks in the middle for groups) places are limited and booths will be allocated to the first 7 booked.
