
The uniform shop at the Primary school will be open during the 'School Holiday Office Opening Hours'. See left.

The Prefects raised \$574, which was a great effort. The raffle prize was won by Felicity. Congratulations!










Haystacks Cup 3

Anchor Week 2021

Anchor week is a week of worship here at Carmel, where we can step away from regular school stress and struggles to really further our spirituality, starting each day with an extra spoonful of prayer, music and God's word.

For our second Anchor week of the year, we had



the privilege of listening to Pr. John Beck, who shared with us his many stories. Students voiced to the prefect team, that they found this Anchor Week really interesting and engaging because of Pr. John's real-life stories, addressing real-life issues.

We started the week learning about his history and became more educated on Indigenous Australians history and the hardships faced when 'swimming the river' known as life. From this, he shared stories similar to that of The Prodigal Son encompassing the theme 'Come Home,' and further how the choices we make can affect our own lives and walks with God. Our Anchor Weeks Drama Team brought to life the story of the Prodigal Son through an original skit called, "The Child Prodigy."

As the week drew to a close, the message conveyed the theme 'The Storms,' and how hard times can strengthen you. Here Pr. John left us with the words, "Storms in our life will come and go, but if we build our life on the word of God, we will stand." This phrase linked to our theme song, 'Never Lost,' with the lyrics stating God "can do all things but fail,' because he's never lost a battle. God's ultimate strength and power is a solid foundation for our relationship with him, and we can depend on him always - especially throughout the storms because he has never once lost a battle.

Prefects from the design team came together to create small take-home gifts for the students. These were small cork top jars containing mustard seeds and a sprig of rosemary. Mustard seeds are a symbol of faith, reminding us that faith can grow from small things, and were chosen to portray soil. The rosemary plant is a symbol of remembrance seen throughout the Bible. We paired these two things together to say remember this week. Remember the music, the stories shared by Pr John, and remember to continue growing your faith going forward from Anchor Week 2021.
