

Year 10 longitudinal study

Our Year 10 students have been invited to participate in the first year of a new longitudinal study of young people in Australia. In 2022, the GENERATION study will focus on the activities and aspirations of Year 10 students – what they are doing now and what they think they would like to do in the future with study, training and employment.

Each student who completes the survey will receive an individual summary of their careers interests, while the school will receive a summary report of the plans of Year 10 students as a group. No individual student will be identified in the school report.

There are plans for another 10 years of surveys in this longitudinal study. Students will be asked if they are interested in participating in later years of the study. If students agree to participate in later years, they will be asked to provide their contact details. Please note that it is not a requirement for students to participate in later years, and all questions in the survey are voluntary.

Further information about the study will be provided to all Year 10 families along with a consent form. If you have any questions about the survey, please contact Amanda Lobegeiger.

All data will be kept strictly confidential and no individual student or school will be identified in published data or reports.













Narnia Comes to Carmel Secondary

Carmel Adventist College (Secondary) experienced an Anchor Week [based on Hebrews 6:19] that was unlike any other, a week where students and staff alike literally walked through the wardrobe to experience the deeper meaning behind the story of Narnia written by C.S. Lewis which was utilised to point us to the true story of Christ. This is one students' perspective.

"Anchor Week was truly an amazing experience for all the students, as we stepped into another world and discovered the deeper meaning behind the story of Narnia.

On day one, we took our first step through the wardrobe as we learnt about the idea of the cosmic conflict worldview. We learnt about the symbolism of Narnia; how Aslan represents Jesus and the white witch represents Satan, and how we are stuck in between this war, with the choice of which side to join.

On Tuesday the focus was on Turkish Delight, the temptation that Edmund faced in the story. We discovered how everyone's 'Turkish delight' temptations are different and the devil uses these to distract us from our true mission and purpose. Pastor Ben Reynolds taught us a method to fight temptations we might face in our everyday life, and taught us how we have to change our mindset so our thoughts aren't always focused on resisting the temptation. We also learned about how the devil has tried to malign God's reputation, making him appear a tyrant, rather than a loving God who has allowed us free choice that only comes from true love.

On Wednesday we learnt about God's incredible gift to us, how Jesus died so that we could live, represented by Aslan's death on the stone table in the Narnia story. How God created a solution to the cosmic conflict and gave us the assurance of salvation if we only accept it.

It was an extra special experience as we got the opportunity to respond to the messages we had been hearing throughout the start of the week. At the end of Pr Ben's message everyone was given the chance to come up the front and put a stone on the 'stone table' if they wanted to commit their lives to God. 128 students responded to the invitation which is a massive blessing, showing how God is working through the lives of the students in this school.

On Thursday we continued going through the story as we saw how Peter, Edmund, Lucy and Susan were crowned kings and queens of Narnia; given their true identity by Aslan that could never be taken away. We learnt about how other people try to tell us what they believe our identity is, when our true identity is in God, as we are chosen and valuable. We learnt another technique to remind ourselves of our identity in God.

On Friday, the final day of Anchor week focused on what we do after we leave 'Narnia'. We saw how Edmund, Lucy, Susan and Peter returned to their own world, yet they were completely changed from their experience in Narnia. Pr Ben challenged us that after our own Narnia experience, we need to be changed just as the people in Narnia were. He asked us what we would be doing differently and we learnt that God is there to lead us in this change, as the 'director' of our story.

Overall, this week was a special time to connect with each other and deepen our understanding of our walk with God".

On behalf of our Carmel Adventist College and Church communities, I would like to say a massive thank you to everyone who made this Narnia Anchor Week come to life. With a special thank you to Pastor Ben Reynolds for sharing the story of Christ through Narnia with clarity, passion, Biblical depth and relevance to our 2022 context.



Commonwealth School Data Collection Notice

The Australian Government Department of Education, Skills and Employment (the department) would like to advise all parents and guardians that it collects certain information about your child's school, its staff, and student body.

Why is this information collected?

This information is collected by the department in accordance with the *Australian Education Act 2013* (the Act) and the *Australian Education Regulation 2013* (the Regulation). The Act and the Regulation require the legal entity responsible for the administration of the school (the approved authority) to provide certain information to the department. The department collects this information to:

- Ensure the provision of Australian Government funding to schools is properly calculated and appropriately managed.
- Conduct research, statistical analysis and develop school education policy for the Australian Government.
- Meet national and international reporting obligations on school students in Australia.
- Publish and provide information about schools to the public.

How is information collected?

Information is provided to the department by a school or their approved authority via various data collections on the <u>SchoolsHUB website</u>.

What information is collected?

Each data collection fulfils a separate reporting requirement. The data collections conducted through SchoolsHUB are:

- The Student Residential Address and Other Information Collection (Address Collection) provides student residential addresses (excluding student names), and the names and addresses of parents/guardians of students for eligible full or part-time primary and secondary students enrolled at most non-government schools.
- The Financial Accountability (FA) assurance activity is done to certify that the financial assistance provided by the Australian Government for schools has been spent or committed to be spent to provide school education.
- The Financial Questionnaire (FQ) reports the income, expenditure, assets and liabilities from all non-government Australian schools receiving Australian Government recurrent grant funding.
- Student Attendance (STATS) provides a school's student attendance rate data by grade, gender
 and Indigeneity from non-government schools for full-time students in Years 1 to 10 attending
 regular and special schools.
- The Non-Government Schools Census (Census) provides information about the number and characteristics of the school's staff and student body during a specific reference period.
 Characteristics include student year level and workload, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander staff and students, students with disability, students receiving distance education, boarding students, and overseas students. The names of students and staff are not collected, apart from

- the name, position and contact details of the staff member nominated as the primary contact for the annual Census.
- Census Special Circumstances Applications may also be made by schools to include a student/s
 who did not attend during the Census reference period but otherwise meets Census eligibility
 requirements. Schools will provide the department with information and documents about the
 student demonstrating their eligibility. The department does not require information that
 personally identifies a student and asks schools to de-identify any documents before providing
 them.

How will the information be used and disclosed?

Some of the information collected by the department from schools in accordance with the Act and the Regulation, may be 'personal information' for the purposes of the *Privacy Act 1988* (Privacy Act). Personal information is protected by law, including under the Privacy Act. Any use or disclosure of your personal information must occur in accordance with the Regulation. Personal information is information or an opinion about an identifiable individual. Personal information includes an individual's name and contact details.

Personal information collected by the department may be used or disclosed for the following:

- Used by the department to review school funding calculations and develop school education policy.
- Used or disclosed where it is otherwise required or authorised by law, including under the Act or Regulation, or otherwise permitted under the Privacy Act.
- Disclosed to the Australian Bureau of Statistics to calculate your non-government school community's capacity to contribute to the costs of schooling (Address Collection only).
- Disclosed to the Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) to publish on the My School website and include as high-level data for ACARA's National Report on Schooling in Australia and the Productivity Commission Report on Government Services (Census and STATS only).
- Disclosed to State and Territory education departments and authorities in accordance with the Act.
- Disclosed to a contracted auditor where the department decides to audit or verify the information
 provided by an approved authority about a school. The contracted auditor may use previously
 collected information or request access to individual student records for comparison purposes. The
 contractors may pass this information onto officers within the department, if there is a discrepancy
 in the data provided by the school and the school's records and further investigation is required.
 The contracted auditor must handle personal information in accordance with the Privacy Act.
- Disclosed to its service providers for the purposes of the provision of information and communications technology (ICT) support services to the department.
- Other than in exceptional circumstances (for example, investigation of fraud relating to overseas students), the department does not disclose any of the personal information collected to overseas recipients.

For more information about how the department handles personal information, please review the department's <u>privacy policy</u>.

Protecting your child's privacy

When student information is provided to the department by schools or approved authorities, the department requests that the information must not explicitly identify any student. For example, student names or student identifiers are not provided. To help protect your child's privacy, we support schools to submit their reporting requirements using de-identified records.

In limited cases, even without student names or identifiers, a student may be reasonably identifiable from the information provided (for example, because of the small size of a particular school). In this event, the disclosure of such personal information to the department by a school, and the collection of that personal information by the department, are both required and authorised by law for the purposes of the Privacy Act.

What do you need to do?

You do not need to do anything. Your school is responsible for providing the requested information to the department.

If you are willing as a parent or guardian to allow your child to take part in this project there is nothing further you need to do. If however you are not happy for your child to participate, please let either the school know or the lead researchers listed below. Please note that at the time the survey is administered, each student will have the project fully explained to them, with the choice to participate or not.
