#### **IMPORTANT VACCINATION INFORMATION**

The WA Department of Health is undertaking an awareness campaign to remind all parents to have their child's immunisations up to date. To ensure children are protected against vaccine preventable diseases the vaccination rate of children in the community should be 95%. Currently in WA, vaccination rates are 91% thus placing our children at risk. Please ensure that your child's vaccinations are up to date and if you have a child starting school in 2016 ensure they are fully vaccinated prior to beginning school. *Please note: The school is required to keep on file a copy of all students vaccination records. Please send a copy to the school whenever your records are updated.*
