From our Chaplain...

How blessed we are here at Carmel Primary that we have two separate entities who believe in a chaplaincy program which provides another layer of support to students, families and staff at Carmel Primary.

Our chaplaincy program is jointly funded by the Australian Government under the National School Chaplaincy Program (NSCP) and the Western Australian Conference of the Seventh-day Adventist Church. Funding of ten hours per week from the NSCP is used to facilitate parts of our Chaplaincy Program, which focus more on building resiliency, emotional and pastoral care such as (though not limited to) special school events, excursions, sport activities and camps.

The remainder of the funding for this role comes from the WA Conference of the SDA Church which also supports those parts of our program focused on resiliency and relationship building but also on aspects which are Christian in their orientation, such as weekly chapels, Bible studies, church services, our annual Easter Camp and Weeks of Worship.
