#### Story: The Golden Gift

Some time ago, a friend of mine punished his 3-year old daughter for wasting a roll of gold wrapping paper. Money was tight, and he became infuriated when the child tried to decorate a box to put under the tree.

Nevertheless, the little girl brought the gift to her father the next morning and said, "This is for you, Daddy." He was embarrassed by his earlier overreaction, but his anger flared again when he found that the box was empty. He yelled at her, "Don't you know when you give someone a present, there's supposed to be something inside of it?"

The little girl looked up at him with tears in her eyes and said, "Oh, Daddy, it's not empty. I blew kisses into the box. All for you, Daddy."

The father was crushed. He put his arms around his

little girl, and begged for forgiveness. My friend told me that he kept that old box by his bed for years. Whenever he was discouraged, he would take out an imaginary kiss and remember the love of the child who had put it there.

In a very real sense, each of us as parents has been given a gold container filled with unconditional love and kisses from our children. There is no more precious possession anyone could hold.

#### School Improvement Survey



All Adventist Schools in Australia will be participating in the Insight School Survey - 2016, which will provide data from students, staff and parents about our school's cultural behaviour, relationships and learning community which will assist us to focus our efforts for improvement by building on our successes to date.

From 25th of August to the 2nd of September, all staff, students from Years 3-6 and all parents, will be asked to complete a survey. Staff and students will complete the survey online at school. Parents will receive a letter today from their oldest enrolled child at Carmel Primary. This letter has a unique code which also allows you to access the survey online. The survey will take about 15-20 minutes to complete.

A survey consultant (Insight SRC) has been engaged to manage the data collection. The survey data will be kept strictly confidential and no individual will be identified to the school or the Adventist Schools Australia Office.

I would encourage your participation, as this will help our school to identify our strengths and areas in which we can focus our improvement.

About 2 years ago we did a paper based survey with Endeavour. The information from that report has been invaluable in helping the School Council and the staff target development at the primary school. In our last survey, Carmel Adventist College Primary had the highest response rate of any school surveyed by Endeavour. Such an excellent response rate ensures that we get a wide range of data from across the school which in turn gives great integrity to the data.

Important Note: The unique code is relevant to Carmel Primary only. A separate survey with a separate code will be conducted for the Secondary Campus. The reason for the separate survey is so that each school can target its individual focus areas.

#### From our Librarian...




It's been a busy two weeks in the library. The scholastic book fair was a great success. We earned an impressive commission of \$900 to spend on new books.
