#### A PERFECT LIFE

In bowling it is 300 - a perfect score. It occurs in ten frames with every pin being knocked down on the first and only ball. It is a rare but not an exceedingly unusual feat. Still, there have only been 22 perfect games ever on TV in the Pro Bowlers Association. You can even purchase a special ring when you have a perfect game "sanctioned" by the national body.

Troy Walker could almost taste the ring. He was in the 10th frame, having mowed down the first 9 frames without a pin standing when, after having thrown the ball, the lane rack dropped down and the sweep came out and deflected his ball from striking any of the pins. On his next throw, he left pins standing (*The Huffington Post*).

How must he have felt to be that close to perfection and yet so far away? Fortunately for me, I have never been that close to perfection. A long time ago I fell from that perfection with my very first sin and worse yet, I keep sinning. I resemble the remark made in Romans 3:10 that says, "None is righteous, no, not one." And so do you. - Willing to sign a Statutory Declaration confirming that the information provided is true and correct





# **CONDITIONS FOR BUS TRAVEL**

The Golden Rule: Obey the instructions of your Bus Driver

#### Safety Rules:

- Where seatbelts are fitted, they must be worn.
- Stay in your seat at all times.
- Do not lean against the doors or out the windows.
- Stand away from Bus after getting off and do not cross the road until it is clear.
- Do not cross in front of the Bus.
- Do not throw anything in or out of the Bus.
- Put Bags under seat, between your feet or on your lap. Bags are not permitted in the Aisle.

#### **Behaviour Rules:**

- Keep voices at a reasonable level.
- No inappropriate language, verbal teasing, play fighting or other physical contact.
- While the Bus is waiting at the School in the afternoon, you cannot leave the Bus without the Driver's permission.
- Do not call out of the Bus windows.

#### **Property Rules:**

- Do not eat on the bus. Only drink water.
- Parents will be financially responsible for any damage to bus exterior or interior including seats and seat covers.

#### Administrative Rules:

- Casual use of the Bus service is permitted within the following guidelines:
  - Ticket to be purchased at School Reception prior to trip unless another financial arrangement has been approved by the Bus Administrator.
  - The Pick-up or Drop-off is an existing stop on an Established Route.
- Parents must notify the Bus Administrator of changes to times, locations or days in writing, with at least 24 hours notice.
- Last minute changes, notified to the driver by the student will be denied and alternative transport will be required at the parent's cost.

A serious view will continue to be taken if misbehaviour occurs or offences are perpetrated. Repeated breaking of Rules will lead to disciplinary action or loss of Bus privileges.
