#### Kindergarten/ Pre-Primary African Inquiry



Dear Parents,

This term, the Kindergarten and Pre-Primary classes are conducting an inquiry into Africa. Our focus in this project is looking at the strong community that exists within an African village. Linked to this, we are also investigating how clay and mud are used in traditional African culture as a building material.

In order to assist our students to make a strong connection with both of these ideas we have chosen to make an African hut in our outside learning area. Where possible we have used local natural materials and manual labour and skills provided by our students.

This project has taken all of Term 3 and will continue into Term 4 before it is completed. It is hoped that it will remain an important part of our learning area for many years to come.

Once our African hut is finished I would like to decorate it in traditional African symbols, patterns, designs and colours that represent the broad cross section of African cultures that we have within our school community. If you would like to suggest a particular design that represents your own African cultural connection I would be very happy to receive it. Once I have all of the suggestions I will arrange a painting and decorating day. I am happy for families to be part of this experience.
