Fire Season

With summer just around the corner, here is a reminder of our fire safety procedures.



Any day classed as being a CATASTROPHIC FIRE DAY in the Perth Hills will result in school being cancelled for the day.

All schools in the Hills are on a special alert system and will be notified if such a day is forecast. This alert is normally done by 1pm of the day preceding and allows us time to notify parents.

ABC radio (720AM) announces all fire warnings and regularly keeps up to date. Therefore on extreme weather days, the school office will have the radio playing in the background to simply stay in touch with any current fire warnings.

If ever the school needs to be evacuated off site for events such as a bushfire, our destination is Advent Park Campground, Kalamunda Road, MAIDA VALE. Advent Park has a kitchen, toilets, shade, water and shelter available. This is also the location of off campus evacuation for the High School Campus.

If you at any stage hear of schools in this area being evacuated, please do not rush to school to collect students as you may create traffic issues that would prolong evacuation.



Kindy Enrolments

Enrolments are being received for our 3 year-old and 4 year-old Kindy program for 2021. If you have not yet enrolled your child for next year, we encourage you to do so.

The 3 year-old Kindy program runs 2 days a week (Tuesday and Thursday). You have the option to enrol your child for either ½ days or full days. All children need to have turned three prior to starting 3 year-old Kindy.

The 4 year-old Kindy program runs 3 days a week (Monday, Wednesday and Friday), with the option to enrol for 5 days.

Once enrolled, this is carried over into the following year, so no further action is required.

CONDITIONS FOR BUS TRAVEL

Safety Rules:

♦Where seatbelts are fitted, they must be worn.

Stay in your seat at all times.

♦ Do not lean against the doors or out the windows.

Stand away from Bus after getting off and do not cross the road until it is clear.

♦Do not cross in front of the Bus.

♦Do not throw anything in or out of the Bus.

♦Put Bags under seat, between your feet or on your lap. Bags are not permitted in the Aisle.

Behaviour Rules:

♦Keep voices at a reasonable level.

♦No inappropriate language, verbal teasing, play fighting or other physical contact.

While the Bus is waiting at the School in the afternoon, you cannot leave the Bus without the Driver's permission.

✤Do not call out of the Bus windows.

Property Rules:

Do not eat on the bus. Only drink water.

Parents will be financially responsible for any damage to bus exterior or interior including seats and seat covers.

Administrative Rules:

Casual use of the Bus service is permitted within the following guidelines:

- Ticket to be purchased at School Reception prior to trip unless another financial arrangement has been approved by the Bus Administrator.

- The Pick-up or Drop-off is an existing stop on an Established Route.

Parents must notify the Bus Administrator of changes to existing times, locations or days in writing, with at least 24 hours notice.

Stops are reviewed, and new ones assigned, at the beginning of each term. You would be welcome to use an existing stop until one has been assigned.

Last minute changes, notified to the driver by the student will be denied and alternative transport will be required at the parent's cost.

A serious view will continue to be taken if misbehaviour occurs or offences are perpetrated. Repeated breaking of Rules will lead to disciplinary action or loss of Bus privileges
