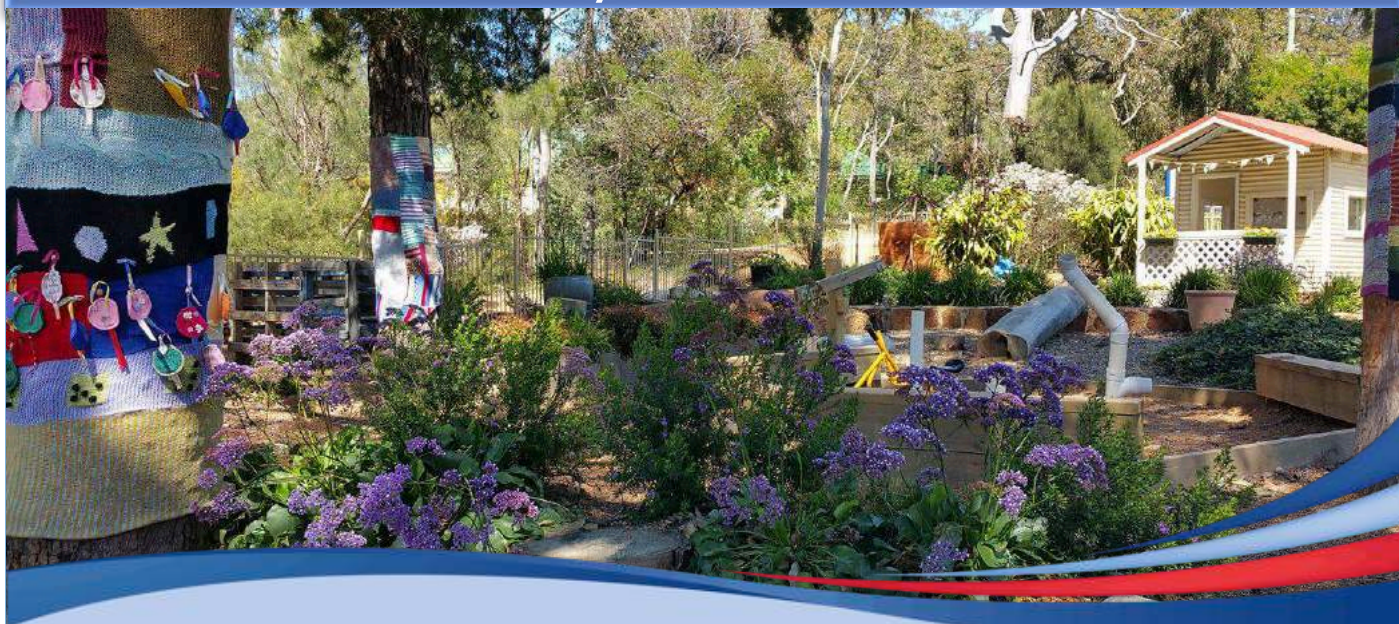

From our Chaplain...

How blessed we are here at Carmel Primary that we have two different entities who believe in a chaplaincy program and support it financially.

Our school chaplaincy program is jointly funded by the Australian Government under the National School Chaplaincy Program (NSCP) and, the Western Australian Conference of the Seventh-day Adventist Church. Funding of 10 hours per week from the NSCP is used to facilitate those parts of our Chaplaincy Program which focus more on building resiliency, emotional and pastoral support such as (though not limited to) Protective Behaviours, Stephanie Alexander Gardening Program, school excursions, sport activities and camps. Funding from the WA Conference is also used to facilitate those parts of our program, which focus on resiliency and relationship building but is also used for those aspects of our program which may be deemed more Christian in their orientation, such as weekly chapels, Bible studies and the annual Week of Worship.

An exciting new program we have initiated this term is Storytime in the Bush. A huge thank you to our families who helped letterbox 2000 flyers. These interactive, literacy bush walks have proved very popular with our community and we have been able to introduce our school to twelve new families. Our Tuesday morning class filled quickly and our families are loving the walks and our school. So spread the word, if you have friends with children aged from 2-5, we are taking bookings for Term 1, 2017.

I believe we have something very special here at Carmel Primary, which we want to share it with others. Help us spread the good word about Carmel Primary.

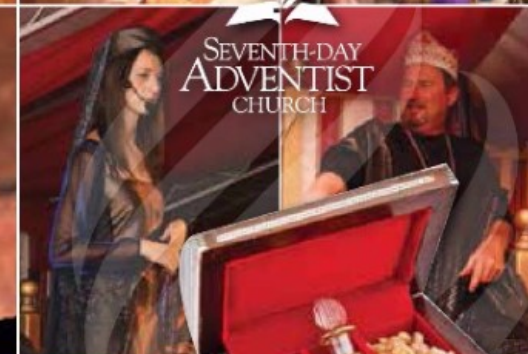
