Applications for exemption need to be submitted by Wednesday, 11th April.

Parking

We recommend that if your child is participating in the Wednesday after school activities that an **extra snack/fruit** is put in their lunch box to eat before starting the activity.




Weet-Bix TRYathlon




The Scholastic Book Fair is coming to Carmel from Monday, 19th to Wednesday, 21st March!

From our Chaplain...

How blessed we are here at Carmel Primary that we have two separate entities who believe in a chaplaincy program which provides another layer of support to students, families and staff at CACP.

Our chaplaincy program is jointly funded by the Australian Government under the National School Chaplaincy Program (NSCP) and the Western Australian Conference of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.

Funding of ten hours per week from the NSCP is used to facilitate parts of our Chaplaincy Program which focus




