### After School Pick-up / Supervision

#### **Change to Travel Arrangements**

Please ensure that any change of plans to afternoon transport details are made directly to the class teacher or through the office by a parent or a guardian (not a student). This includes students using the free shuttle service down to the High School. Changes to plans can be by means of a written note, a phone call or an email by a parent or guardian.

This also includes change of plans for After School Activities on a Wednesday. If your child/ren are not participating in After School Activities, then contact must be made to the front office.

Please note that in the absence of permission or notification from you, we have no choice but to follow the regular routine for your children.

#### **Teacher Supervision**

At the end of the day, our teachers are on duty to supervise students who are leaving the school grounds. Their focus will be on supervising students at this time, so if you wish to discuss your child's progress, please make an appointment for a more suitable time. Thank-you.
