Term 2 Uniforms

Term 2 means Winter Uniform!

Boys – long grey trousers, blue logo shirt, black polished laceup shoes, knitted logo jumper and tie.

Girls – skirt, white logo blouse, black polished lace-up shoes, knitted logo jumper and white socks or black stockings.

Winter sport uniform replaces the shorts with long micro fibre pants and sports jacket. For added warmth and rain protection, our optional winter jacket is also available in the uniform shop.

To help you prepare for the winter uniform, the Primary shop is open Friday mornings from 8:45am – 9:15am. The Secondary campus shop is open Monday and Wednesday from 9am – 3:30pm or by prior arrangement.



ARRIVING...

For parents transporting their children directly to the field, please note the following: **Students need to be at the track by 9am.**

DID YOU KNOW ...?

- For every ton of PET produced for store bought water, 3 tons of carbon dioxide is released.

- We can visually represent the energy embodied in a water bottle by filling one quarter of the bottle with oil. This is because it can take 250mL of oil to produce 1L of bottled water.
- Plastic bottles are among the ten most common rubbish items picked up on Clean Up Australia Day.


