SPORTS MODIFIED

Sorry Dads, this week's article is not on tricking up the family car. One of the main slogans for the Active after Schools (sport) Communities was, 'Small Steps to Big Things'. It was a great program to encourage everyone to participate, learn and have fun. The games were aimed at inclusion while developing skills and ability.

When it comes to independence and responsibility many parents have a training or exercise program to help them develop these skills and abilities, but may not know it. Let me share a little on how it might work for you.

The goal is to help children safely move from reliant infants through to independent adults. It's a big process that shouldn't be left to chance or society. To protect and develop independence at the same time can be tricky. One useful tool is to Sports Modify.

Let me put this in a football analogy. Do children start in the AFL or in Aus-Kick? Though the game is ultimately the same, the rules are modified and made easier for kids to understand. Now we apply these 'sports modifications' to real life and we get...

Paying the bills - For a school excursion, lunch or banking. We empower them with the use of money.

Timetabling - Remembering an activity after school teaches the importance of being organised.

Freedom to travel - Riding their bike or walking somewhere unaccompanied (not necessarily without supervision) teaches independence.

When young people are allowed to do jobs for themselves it sends a powerful message. It tells them that you believe in them and think that they are capable. Many tasks need to be modified to suit their age, skills and abilities. Success should be of benefit to themselves and to the family.







