Important Information

School Attendance & Absentees

How to manage attendance or absence for the first 3 weeks of Term 2, as outlined as phase one by the WA Government.

- If your child is attending school, you do not need to do anything different. Attendance will be recorded as normal on SEQTA.
- Normal procedures apply for incidental absences.
 Please just send a written note, send a Skoolbag notification or phone advising the reason for the absence.
- If you are opting to have your child **learn at home** for all, **or** part, of this 3 week period, please inform us in writing of your decision (email is fine).

Morning Drop Off

We will be continuing the same morning drop off routine as last term.

ALL students are to be dropped off in the morning at the gates.

For Kindy/Pre Primary students, the gate from the carpark will be the entry used for the Early Childhood area.

We are asking that parents DO NOT enter with their children until further notice. We will have a staff member at the two gates to assist students if required.

Late Arrivals

If your child arrives late, please bring them to the gate near the office.

For Kindy and Pre Primary students, bring them to the steps near the office and we will deliver them to class for you.

The late registrar will be signed on your behalf by office staff.

Afternoon Pick Up

We kindly ask if Parents and Carers please wait at, or outside the bollards, at the Library gate entrance. Students will be released to you as we see you arrive.

Sickness or Emergency

Children who are sick should be kept at home.

Unfortunately, there will be times when children become ill or are involved in an accident at school. Should this happen, every attempt will be made to contact parents/carer or emergency contact numbers listed on your child's enrolment form. Please inform the school of any changes to contact details should they occur.

People listed as emergency contacts need to be able to collect your child if we are unable to contact you, especially if your child is unwell.

Front Office Access

If you need to come into the office, you will be required to complete and sign a 'Visitor Access to School Site Form'. This form is a declaration that is now required due to COVID-19.

Please ensure that only one parent enters this space at a time. If someone is already in the office, please wait in the breezeway, with a safe distance between you. Thank you.

We encourage you to please email or ring through your enquiries. We will endeavor to answer your questions promptly.

Year 1-6

Boys – college grey trousers, blue logo shirt and button up collar, school tie, black polishable lace-up shoes with grey socks and navy blue v-neck knit pullover with logo.

Girls – tartan skirt, white shirt with logo, white ankle socks (one fold) OR black/navy stockings, black polishable lace-up shoes and navy blue v-neck knit pullover with logo.

Sport Uniform - blue/gold polo t-shirt with logo, blue microfibre sport track pants (uniform shop only), blue/gold microfibre jacket with logo and sneakers (predominantly white, blue, black, red and grey).

The blue school hat is also required. Uniform beanie (optional).

3YO Kindy, 4YO Kindy & Pre-Primary

3YO Kindy – blue polo t-shirt with logo, fleece jumper and track pants (uniform shop only).

4YO Kindy & Pre-Primary – blue/gold polo t-shirt with logo, fleece jumper and track pants (uniform shop only).

Shoes – sneakers (predominantly white, blue, black, red or grey).

The blue school hat is also required. A uniform beanie is optional.

School jackets with College logo (available at the Secondary uniform shop) may be worn for additional warmth. *(Optional)

*Jackets do not replace the navy v-neck jumper with the logo as part of the formal uniform. Formal uniform is required for excursions, special events, public performances and other times outlined in the newsletter from time to time.

If you would like to order lunch for your child on these days, you can either pre-order online or fill in a lunch bag (located outside near the staffroom) and hand your order and money into the front office by 9am.

FREE Flu Vaccine for Children

WA primary school-aged children can receive the influenza vaccine for free (Kindy - to Year 6).

Influenza, commonly known as flu, is a highly contagious disease caused by the influenza virus. Children are at higher risk of serious complications from influenza.

It is strongly recommended that children from six months are immunised against influenza every year.

Where can I get my child get vaccinated?

What will teaching look like at Carmel Primary for the start of Term 2?

Carmel Primary will be open for face-to-face teaching at the start of Term 2 in line with WA Government's Plan for Term 2, based on advice from the Chief Health Officer.

Teachers are very keen to catch-up with their students and I am sure students are feeling the same way.

I have included some notes below about how Learning at home will work. I have tried to summarise the main points, but more specific information will be included in your learning packs.

Learning at Home

- Students learning at home will be given work packages that will include some textbook/paper-based activities and some work to be completed online at sites such as Soundwaves, Maths-on-line, Think Mentals, as designated by the classroom teacher. (Lessons will not be live streamed).
- Work given in these packs will cover all key learning areas. (Work will not be limited to Literacy and Numeracy as for the last 2 or 3 weeks of Term 1).
- Weekly work outlines for individual classes will be uploaded on Seesaw on Wednesday morning, April 29, and then by 9:00am Monday mornings for the following two weeks.
- Teachers will not be available to help students learning at home during the school day. Because most classes will have 75-85% of students present for face-to-face teaching they will be very busy and need to respond to emailed requests for support outside of school hours.
- Teaching staff will make every effort to contact students working at home once a week by phone or online.
- Education Assistants will make contact with students who normally receive in class support once a week. (Please note that EA's are also still working with students in face-to-face classes).
- Teachers will notify students of a weekly class Zoom catch-up meeting/ activity. Watch Seesaw class announcements for more details.
- ZOOM chapel will be available each Friday morning. Mrs Warchol will send details of the link required.
- Some IT support will be available if students are having problems connecting to Zoom meetings or such. Please log your requests for support with Mrs Duncan on 08 9291 6399.
- Students working at home will be required to submit assessments (included in your work pack) each fortnight. We request that these be dropped in when you collect work packages.
- If you are not able to collect physical work packages, please let us know and we will do our best to get these delivered to your home.
- Packs of work can be collected tomorrow from 9:30am-11:00am, or between 4:00pm -5:00pm, tomorrow afternoon. Please let Mrs Duncan know you are at school by knocking on her window/door and the pack will be brought to you.

As we work together during this challenging time, we thank you for your support and patience and we pray for God's protection and peace for you and our school community.
