was full. They agreed that it was. So the professor then picked up a box of pebbles and poured them into the jar. He shook the jar lightly. The pebbles, of course, rolled into the open areas between the rocks. He then asked the students again if the jar was full. They agreed it was.

The professor picked up a box of sand and poured it into the jar. Of course, the sand filled up the remaining open areas of the jar. He then asked once more if the jar was full. The students responded with a unanimous "Yes."

"Now," said the professor, "I want you to recognise that this jar represents your life. The rocks are the important things – your family, your partner, your health, your children – things that if everything else was lost and only they remained, your life would still be full. Changes to Afternoon Transportation and Pick-up Instructions

The safety of your children is of paramount to us and because of this we have policies and routines in place to ensure that students leave the grounds safely once school is over for the day. We know that safety matters to you too, and so we seek your help with what seems to be a growing problem of messages about transport changes coming to us via students. A number of times the messages have been wrong, confused or simply a wish about a play date rather than reality.

Please ensure that any change of plans to afternoon transport details are made directly to the class teacher or through the office by a parent or a guardian (not a student). This includes students using the free shuttle service down to the High School.

Changes to plan can be through a written note, a phone call or an email by a parent or guardian. At times we get students worried or distressed because they believe transport instructions have been changed and because we know nothing about this. In such cases, office staff must make a phone call to confirm whether this is parent authorised and this can take quite some time, particularly if there are multiple children in the same



situation. Having clear instructions allows buses to get away promptly and by doing this minimise the time bus students have to be on the bus.

Your Help

Please note that in the absence of permission from you, we have no choice but to follow the regular routine for your children.

Message for **car students**. All students not travelling by bus, or riding/walking home, are asked to wait in the area near the library under the supervision of teachers. A small number of children are not coming to the area because they know mum or dad will be coming to collect them and so they are keen to get a head start on playtime!

We have no issue at all with parents collecting their children from this area and then taking them back into the school grounds whilst you catch up with teachers or friends, but until you come to collect them, we need them in this space as we have no staff member available for yard supervision during this busy time. Once you have collected them, we deem them to be in your care.

The Protective Behaviours Parent Workshops have been designed to provide parents and caregivers the opportunity to participate in a workshop that is child focused and relevant to parenting in the modern age.

Whilst the task of preventing child abuse appears daunting for most parents - teaching the Protective Behaviours Program is a simple but effective way of helping children develop protective strategies.



In order to work towards preventing children becoming victims of abuse particularly sexual abuse it is important to educate children on their rights to personal safety and the way we do this is by teaching children the following:

As a safety program Protective Behaviours provides children with strategies to keep themselves safe and cope with situations which threaten their wellbeing, specifically in areas of child abuse and bullying. The program in essence empowers the individual with the right to feel safe and sets out ways in which they can gain appropriate help when they are not feeling safe.

WORKSHOP OBJECTIVES

- To provide parents and caregivers with a thorough knowledge of the content, themes, core concepts and strategies of the Protective Behaviours Program.
- To develop problem solving and assertiveness skills in children.
- To educate parents and caregivers in the issues of abuse and abuse prevention.
- To provide parents and caregivers with simple practical teaching activities designed to increase their child's/children's personal safe.
