The impact of persistent absences

Regular attendance is a learned behaviour. Children learn from an early age that punctuality and 'showing up' are expectations that people have of us in various social circumstances. When children engage in activities outside of school - such as sport, employment or even going to the movies - arriving on time is regarded as essential. Attendance patterns are established in the early years of school. Disparities in attendance rates are carried into and become wider in secondary school. These patterns are evident in the early years of schooling and are established or set by Year 3.

Many parents hold the belief that children will not be adversely affected by missing school. Parents would benefit from understanding what normal attendance looks like, and to hear the consistent message that every day that their child misses school will have consequences for their learning and achievement.

Being half an hour late to school each day from Year 1 to Year 10 is approximately equivalent to missing one year of schooling.

The following highlights non-attendance over time. The cumulative effect of persistent non-attendance over the period of compulsory schooling.

| Days absent | Total days | Number of terms | Number of years missed |

| 1 day / week | 451 | 9 | 2yrs 1 term |
| 3 days / week | 1353 | 27 | 6yrs 3 terms |
| Ave 5 days per term | 220 | 5.5 | 1yr 1.5 terms |
| Ave 10 days | 440 | 11 | 2yrs 3 |

WINTER UNIFORM POLICIES

HATS: There are two different styles of hats. Please note that the blue with gold trim hat is for Kindy, Pre Kindy and Pre Primary students only. The plain blue hat is for Years

This differentiation makes it easier to spot our younger students quickly and easily when they are together.

Recently there have been a number of non-uniform items popping up with the onset of cooler weather. Please note the following:

- Ties are required for boys during term 2 and 3
- Black polishable school shoes are compulsory for both boys and girls
- Tights AND socks worn together are not acceptable. Wear one or the other.
- Sports jackets are not acceptable on non-sport days. The knitted/logo jumper is the only option.
- Optional winter jackets (school logo ones) are for travelling to and from school, not for class wear.
- Earrings need to be small and very discreet. Clear, blue or white are the only acceptable colours.
- Shirts are worn tucked in during terms 2 & 3 regardless of logo.
- Nail polish is not to be worn unless it is clear only.
- Hats are to be worn at all play times throughout the year when the UV rating is above 3.
- Ankle socks are exactly that the very low cut/sports ones are not acceptable.
- Hair for girls and boys that is shoulder length or longer needs to be tied back.
- Various tops worn under uniform are not acceptable if they extend beyond the uniform (i.e. long sleeve tops under dresses or short sleeve shirts are not okay).

If students are not in the correct school uniform, they must have a note of explanation from a parent. A uniform pass will be granted for either two days (for minor items such as hats, socks and ties) or a maximum of 5 days (for larger things like jumpers and shoes).

If students are not in the correct school uniform and don't have a note of explanation, they will be restricted to only playing on the verandah.
