NATIONAL MOUNTAIN BIKE CHAMPIONSHIPS



At the State Mountain Bike championships last September, two CAC students, Lily G. and Tate M's results gained them selection to the State MTB Squad. Months of training followed before they travelled with the State Coach to the National Mountain Bike Championships in Canungra, QLD.

There were quite literally, a mountain of challenges. The wet and stormy weather was so bad, it led to the cancellation of the entire Down Hill category of events and throughout the days that followed, there was some question as to whether the Cross Country discipline, in which Lily and Tate compete, would still go ahead. Ultimately, it did, but the race itself was not without its difficulties. On a course that was widely regarded as the most complex and technical ever presented to riders at a national championship, the junior riders (some as young as 11), were expected to complete the same technical elements as the elite riders.

On the first day of competition, Lily and Tate competed in the XCC (cross country criterium), which is a short course event, quicker and far less technical. Tate finished an excellent 9th place in a very large field. While leading her race comfortably, Lily was unfortunately forced to withdraw for medical reasons.

With little time for rest and recovery, they both had to race the following day in the XCO (cross country Olympic) event. While the rain held off, it was still really tough for many of the junior riders. Both Lily and Tate showed real grit and determination to complete their races in very testing conditions. Lily came home in an excellent 4th place, with Tate in 25th in the largest field of the weekend with 32 racers!

The demands of the unusually technical course took them far out of their comfort zone and pushed them to their physical and psychological limits! It was an excellent learning experience for both of them, to see what it takes to be successful at that level, to be able to apply it to their training at home and put it in to practice in the forthcoming WA mountain bike season that starts in 2 weeks. A great job by both and they should be very proud of their results.

Sarah Tucknott, who graduated CAC last year, finished a fantastic 3rd place in the Junior Women's category in the XCO event.


