Last Friday night we enjoyed a delicious vegetarian dinner together. After the dinner we celebrated the transition of our Year 6 students to high school and our Year 12 students to their exciting adventures ahead.

Although the weather wasn't quite ideal, the festivity continued into the College assembly hall where our Chaplain, Miranda, opened the evening with a challenge in gratitude. We learned about the importance of actively pursuing the challenge in 1 Thessalonians 5:18 which says, "Be thankful in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you who belong to Christ Jesus" (New Living Translation).

At first the Bible verse seems slightly absurd, because we question, "What if I don't feel like it?" Interestingly, a study from the University of California conducted in 2003 consisted of randomly assigning one group of study participants to keep a short weekly list of the things they were grateful for, while the other group listed hassles or neutral events. Ten weeks later, the first group enjoyed significantly greater life satisfaction than the second group. What an amazing result! Intentionally forcing yourself to view the positive in life directly impacts your overall life satisfaction/happiness.

Miranda challenged us to write down three things we are grateful for each day for ten weeks and see how changing our thinking can impact our outlook.

We continued the evening hearing from our principals Mrs Janine Taylor (Primary) and Mr Nicholas Thomson (Secondary) who shared highlights from this year and exciting things to look forward to next. They followed this with a short interview of the Year 6's and Year 12's that were present.

We finished by bringing in the Sabbath, where we celebrate having twenty-four hours of not doing what we normally do and intentionally having time in rest, reflection, and growing in our relationships with God, our family, and friends.
