- Explore AQWA after hours on a guided tour of our indoor exhibits,
- Enjoy dinner and breakfast in the AQWA Café
- Take part in crafts & enjoy an ocean-themed movie
- “Camp” out in AQWA’s underwater tunnel surrounded by sharks, stingrays, turtles and hundreds of fish!
- Explore AQWA’s outdoor exhibits, including;
 - The famous touch pool where students can interact with living sea creatures
 - AQWA’s coral reef - one of the largest living coral reef displays in the world
 - See the magical schooling fish at the AQWA Marina

On the following day, students will then travel to Perth Zoo where they will continue their biological extravaganza with guided activities around the zoo and a special education program: Fantastic Beasts and How to Name Them.

Luggage needs to be kept to a reasonable amount.

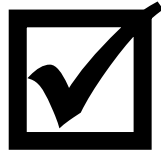
Junk Food and Drinks

Safety and Behaviour Policy

Considerate and sensible behaviour with due regard for the well-being of others, and respect for the environment, should preclude the need for strict rule enforcement.

There are some areas, as indicated below, about which students need to be aware if a harmonious and worthwhile camp is to be affected.

GENERAL BEHAVIOUR

Students are expected to abide by the Carmel College behavioural expectations as outlined on the Carmel College website (and in SEQTA). They are to show respect and show exceptional manners at all times.

SLEEPING

Students are expected to keep their sleeping areas neat and tidy. Girls are not allowed into the boy's sleeping area at any time. The boys are not allowed in the girls' sleeping area at any time. After lights out, silence is expected until morning.

MEALS

Students are expected to use manners at all times. Duties will be given to students who choose not to use correct table etiquette.

CLOTHING

Our camp activities are all active, and students must be prepared with appropriate clothing. Students will be required to wear their PE uniform on Monday whilst participating in the annual cross-country event. They may change into free dress after swimming at the Sorrento Beach. It is important that clothing is modest (particularly swimwear) and does not have inappropriate slogans.

PRIVACY

Students are expected to maintain personal privacy. Appropriate facilities must be used and modesty upheld when using the bathroom and when changing clothes.

DEVICES

Electronic devices are not allowed on camp.

In the event that students need to get in contact with parents or guardians, a teacher will allow supervised access to a telephone.

Students with cameras must ensure that they are using them in a respectful manner.

Photographs should not be taken of students who indicate they are unwilling. Photographs should also not be shared (in either physical or electronic form) without the express consent of the subject **and** their parents/guardians.

SWEETS AND SOFT DRINKS

Any sweets, chips and soft drinks brought on camp will be confiscated.

PUNISHMENT FOR BREACH OF POLICY

Minor breaches will result in extra duties and/or loss of privileges.

Major breaches may result in students returning home at their parents' expense.

Remember, a great camp happens when we all: use excellent manners, share, cooperate, think for ourselves, and consider the needs of others!

Camp Organisers realise the responsibility parents give them when allowing their child to attend camp and endeavour to cover all eventualities. The organisers, like parents, place trust in the students to demonstrate sensible behaviour at all times. All camps are an extension of school and carry the same rules and responsibilities. In addition, AQWA has a set of conditions that must be observed. Students failing to comply with this contract may be returned to home/school at their parent's expense.

Parents/Guardians:

I acknowledge that, in the event of accident or serious illness, the school will take my child for medical assessment/treatment as soon as possible.
